# BEEBE

THOMAS HENRY BEEBE WAS BORN IN COURTLAND COUNTY, NEW YORK FEB. 16, 1831  
 HIS PARENTS AFTERWARDS MOVED TO HURON COUNTY, OHIO. WHERE HE RESIDED UNTIL 1852 21 YRS.  
 WHEN HE CAME TO THIS STATE VIA THE ISTHMUS. FOLLOWING THE EXAMPLE OF EARLY SETTLERS, MR. BEEBE BECAME A MINER, SEEKING THE GOLDEN TREASURE IN THE PLACERS OF EL DORADO COUNTY. IN APRIL, 1854, HE CAME TO THIS COUNTY (SAN MATEO) SETTLING NEAR THE RANCH OF MR. DURHAM (W.W.) WHERE HE HAS RESIDED EVER SINCE, WITH THE EXCEPTION OF TWO YEARS, FROM 1859 TO 1861, WHEN HIS HOME WAS IN PLUMAS COUNTY, AND AN ABSENCE OF FOUR MONTHS IN 1880, ON A VISIT TO HIS EASTERN HOME.

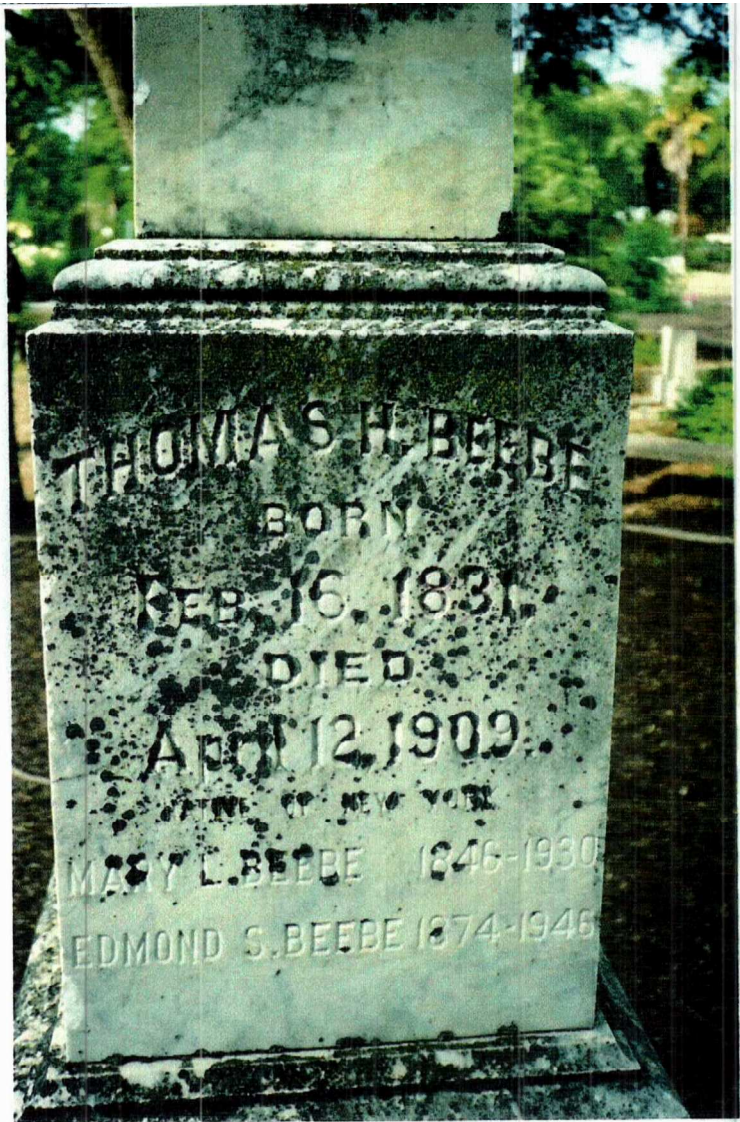

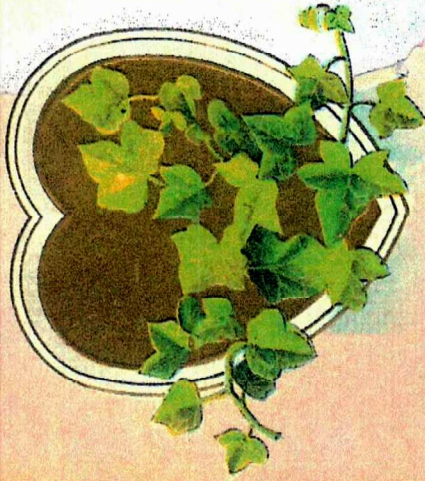

## Pioneer Passes Away.

Thomas Beebe, one of the old residents of the coastside passed away at his home near Lobitos Sunday, after a long illness. The deceased had resided in the county 50 years, following the occupation of a farmer. He was a stirring citizen and respected by a large circle of friends. The burial took place in Union Cemetery Tuesday afternoon, Rev. C. C. Kirtland conducting the services at the grave. Mr. Beebe was a native of New York, aged 78 years. He leaves a wife, grown up daughter and son.

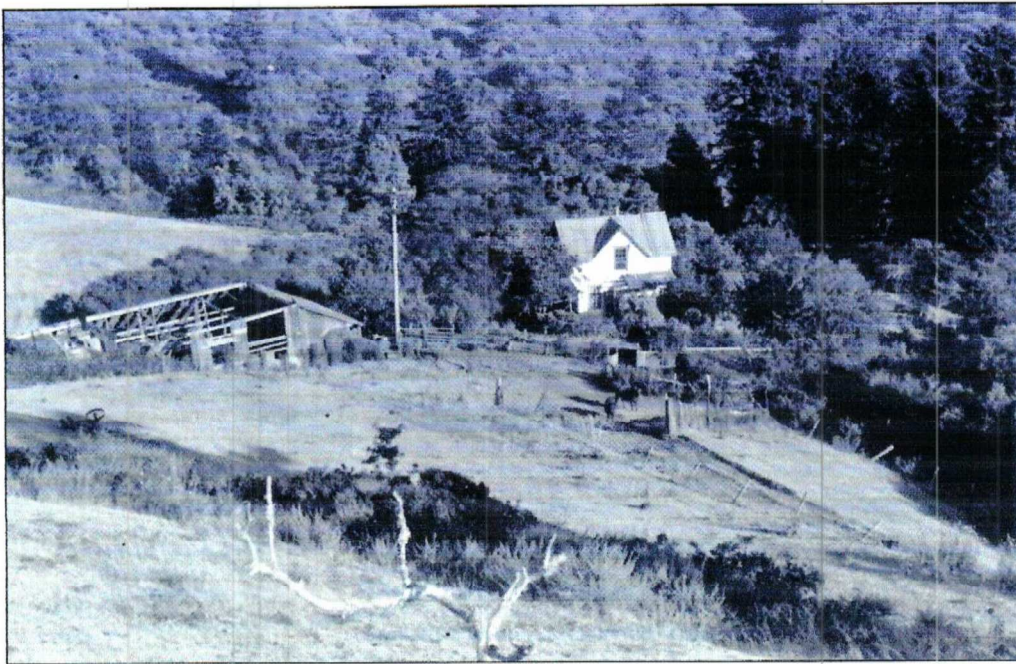

The mountain's dairying families were closely linked and not just by geography. Such was the case with the Beebes. In Tunitas Canyon, brothers Thomas G. and William W. Durham owned a square mile of land and cut what is said to be the first road on the mountain. Just south, another dairying family of Jacob Downing had an additional mile of land.
